Mildura Health Private Hospital (MHPH) is a 56-bed private hospital including a 29-bed Medical/ Surgical In-patient Ward, with two enhanced care beds and a treatment room; a Day Procedure Unit; five Operating Theatres, a Day Oncology Unit; and partnership with Mildura Health Private Consulting.

Specialties include Cardiology (pacemaker insertions), Dental, Ear Nose and Throat, General Medicine, General Practice, General Surgery, Gynaecology, Oncology, Ophthalmology, Oral & Maxillofacial, Orthopaedics, Palliative Care, Plastic / Reconstructive, Sleep Studies, Urology and Vascular.

The Mildura Health ICON Cancer Centre incorporates Medical Oncology services with eight treatment chairs and a procedure room, Radiation Oncology services (ICON Cancer Care), consulting rooms and telehealth facilities.

Mandatory Requirements

- Current AHPRA Registration.
- Satisfactory National Police Check.
- Current Employee Working with Children's Check.
- Immunisation History (MHPH will supply documentation).
- Satisfactory Health Declaration (MHPH will supply documentation).
- Photo Identification (Drivers Licence / Passport).
- Vaccination against Influenza is a mandatory requirement for healthcare workers in Victoria, and as such, all employees at Mildura Health Private Hospital.
- In accordance with the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) advice and the Australian Immunisation Handbook, it is strongly recommended that Victorian healthcare workers remain up to date with their COVID-19 vaccinations.

Key Selection Criteria

- Post Graduate qualifications in oncology (desirable).
- Previous experience working in oncology setting.
- Previous management experience (desirable).
- Recent experience in the private healthcare sector (desirable).
- Sound understanding of quality management systems / principles including quality improvement; workplace health and safety; infection control and healthcare accreditation programs.
- Excellent communication, organisational and time management skills.

Key Responsibilities

- Attendance at Multidisciplinary team and other meetings in relation to the planning and delivery of care.
- Facilitate timely scheduling of appointments, diagnostic testing, and procedures to expediate the treatment plan and promote continuity of care.
- Facilitate continuity of care between health professionals and across care settings by establishing clear referral pathways and timely communication.
- Act as a liaison between people affected by cancer and members of the health care team.
- Undertake comprehensive assessment and screening for clinical, psychological, and supportive care needs upon initial encounter and periodically throughout treatment.
- Identify people at risk for adverse clinical and psychological outcomes and those with potential barriers to care.
- Provide timely and consistent education and information to patients and their families.

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- Provide clinical leadership and mentorship within the clinical team.
- Provide clinical support to medical oncologist/s.
- Facilitate delivery of cancer care consistent with evidence-based guidelines.
- Implement and participate in quality improvement activities that aim to improve provision and coordination of care and optimise outcomes for individuals and services.
- Manage oral chemotherapy treatment regimens.
- Manage supportive therapy treatment regimens (subcutaneous and intramuscular)
- Coordinate phone triage / symptom urgent review clinic (SURC).
- Coordinate patient follow-up post initial treatment.

General Responsibilities

- Understand and practice within own scope of practice
- Integrate nursing and health care knowledge, skills, and attitude to provide high-quality, safe, and effective nursing care
